- Pray for our many leaders, campers and staff to have a great night's sleep!

## Tuesday

- Pray for safety, protection and grace throughout the day.
- Pray for gospel conversations, attentive spirits and a deep love for God for all campers.
- Bible study: God's children LOVE God, looking at Matthew 22:34–38 and Matthew 13:44
- Pray for our many leaders, campers and staff to have a great night's sleep!

#### Wednesday

- Pray for children God would open hearts to respond to the gospel in faith and repentance.
- Pray for our leaders to lovingly engage hearts with the gospel in all circumstances.
- Bible study: God's children TRUST God, looking at Jeremiah 17:5–8 and Psalm 9:10
- Pray for our many leaders, campers and staff to have a great night's sleep!

## Thursday

- Pray for children to hear the Lord's voice in the midst of being tired and lean on Him.
- Pray for our leaders continued patience, energy and endurance as they model Christlikeness.
- Bible study: God's children OBEY God, looking at John 14:15 and Psalm 19:7–8
- Pray for families to build relationships with one another at dinner, that they might be able to spur one another on to good works as they raise tiny disciples.

#### Friday

- Pray that the seeds planted in the hearts of our kids would produce a harvest of righteousness according to God's timing and pleasure.
- Consider having a one-on-one conversation with your child, walking through their camper book and asking how you can pray for them after their week at camp.
